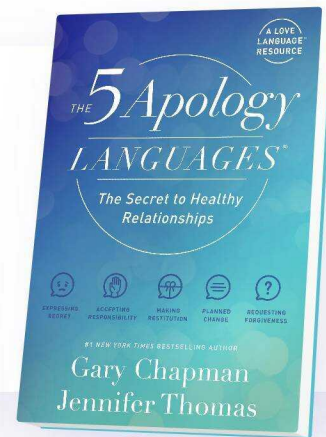
Genuinely Repent
